Citations in brackets should be separated with comma or by semi-colon, as shown in the following example: (Rais et al. 2007; Paradise 2002, 2016; Simionescu 1907, 1920).

Tables, Charts, Photographs: You may include maximally one of the items, with minimum resolution of 300 dpi. The item should match the width of a full page (160 mm) or the width of a single column (75 mm). Use the following abbreviations in text: Tab. for table, Fig. for line graph or photograph. Colour figures will appear in black-and-white in the printed version of the symposium handbook; the original colour figures will appear in the digital version. Please insert tables or figures to the Abstract. Besides, submit the figure or table as a separate file, using jpg format, with minimum resolution of 300 dpi.
